Kids CAEP-ERs: a Day in the Emergency Department

This is a preview of what you can expect.

The basic principles of emergency care of children are similar to those in adults, but the details can sometimes be very different. As emergency physicians across the country are exposed in varied amounts to pediatric patients — ranging from almost never in some urban centres, to a healthy proportion in many community hospitals, to an almost unique practice in pediatric centres — the level of comfort in dealing with children in the ED is also extremely varied.

The goal of this Roadshow is to help all physicians in the emergency department to acquire or maintain a practical evidence-based approach to the diagnosis and treatment of pediatric problems. Such an approach will help physicians to feel more comfortable when dealing with children, and, ultimately, contribute to improving the quality of care.

By the end of this program, the participant should feel more comfortable is his or her ability to deal with children in the emergency department. He or she will do this by reviewing, in depth, the practical approaches to 7 pediatric problems, identifying several specific elements in each that can be used to assess his or her current practice, and plan changes as necessary. The following problems will be presented for review with the speakers.

1. Fever without apparent source in children 0 to 36 months
2. Suicide in adolescents
3. Abdominal pain
4. Respiratory distress
5. Procedural sedation
6. Child abuse
7. Head injury

All activities are based on case discussions of an interactive and practical nature. Participants receive a workbook that contains the cases and questions for use during the day. A separate course manual containing a summary of all the information reviewed and additional background information will be provided at the end of the day.

In addition to providing you with useful tools for your daily practice, CAEP Roadshows are designed to be enjoyable. Come and join us — you will learn a lot, make some new friends, and have some fun!
